## Value Antwerp diamond trade rises in September

Antwerp, October 21<sup>st</sup> 2013 - The monthly figures of the Antwerp diamond trade indicate September was a rather calm but good month. Especially in value, the statistics show an increase compared to September 2012.

When we take a look at the value figures, we see both polished export and import figures rose with respectively 2.69% and 16.98% compared to the same month last year. The volume of exported polished diamonds decreased with 8.50% but the imported volume of polished diamonds increased with 7.33%.

The trade value of rough diamond import dropped 2.45% compared to August 2012 but the export value rose 4.25%. In volume terms, imports rose 1.39% and exports decreased 9.81%.

Overall we can say it was a rather slow but good month. At the end of the month, some Jewish Holidays took place; which can explain why trade was a bit slower.
